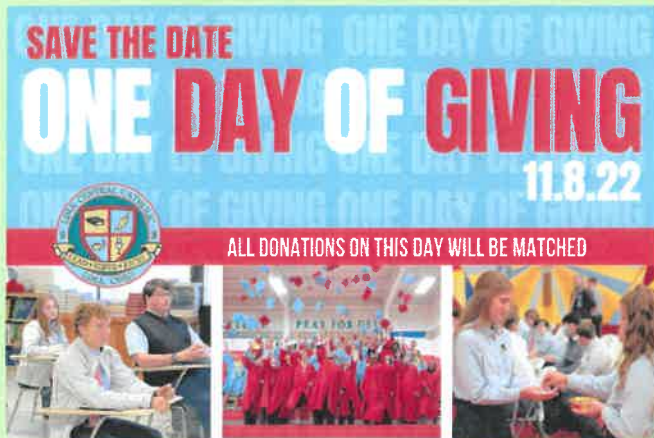
Due to parent teacher conferences this week, St. Gerard School will not be in session on Friday, November 4th.

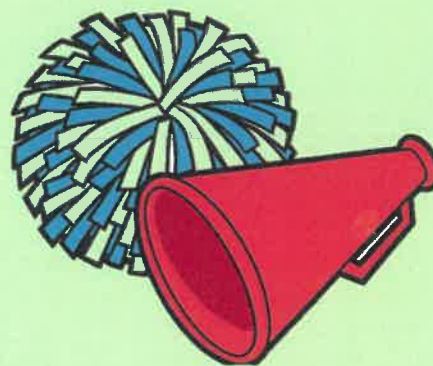
Junior High Cheerleading:

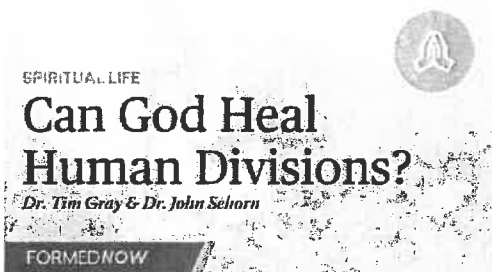

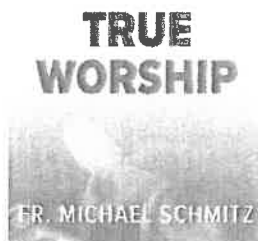
Blessed Duns Scotus

CELEBRATE ST. MARTIN OF TOURS



November 11

Saint Martin of Tours was a Roman soldier who was baptized as an adult and became a bishop in a French town. The most notable of his saintly acts was he had cut his cloak in half to share with a beggar during a snowstorm, to save him from the cold as then that night, he dreamt of Jesus, wearing the half-cloak and saying to the angels, "here is Martin, the Roman soldier who is now baptized; he has clothed me."

On St. Martin's Day, children in Flanders, the southern and northern parts of the Netherlands, and the Catholic areas of Germany and Austria still participate in paper lantern processions. Bonfires are built and children carry lanterns in the streets after dark.
