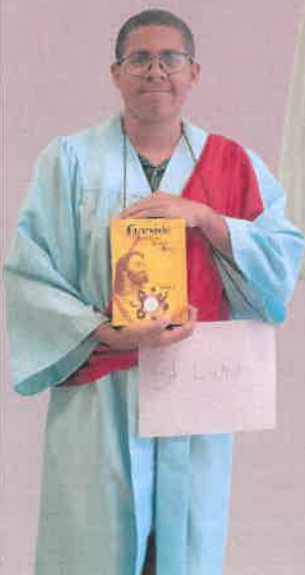

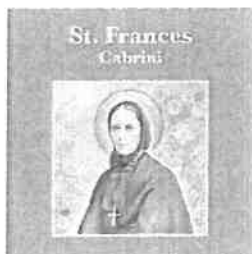

CELEBRATE ST. ELIZABETH OF HUNGARY



November 17

St. Elizabeth of Hungary was the daughter of a Hungarian king. Elizabeth married a nobleman named Louis at a young age. He complained about the expense of her many charities until he witnessed a miracle. One night, while Elizabeth was secretly delivering bread to the poor, Louis asked to see the contents of her cloak. When she opened her cloak, the bread had been miraculously turned to roses. After Louis died during a Crusade, she became a Third Order Franciscan at Marburg, Germany, where she founded a hospital to care for the sick. She died in 1231 at the age of 24. Elizabeth was declared a saint in 1235. She is the patron of bakers, young brides, widows, those falsely accused, countesses and secular Franciscans.

Eat together

Kalacs (Hungarian Cinnamon Bread)

Ingredients

- 4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/4 cup white sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 envelope active dry yeast
- 1 egg
- 1/4 cup melted butter
- 1 1/4 C. warm milk (110 degrees F/45 degrees C)
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- melted butter for brushing
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/3 cup brown sugar

Directions

1. Place flour, white sugar, salt, and yeast into the bowl of a stand mixer. In a bowl, whisk together egg, melted butter, warm milk, and vanilla extract; pour into the flour mixture. Using dough hook attachment, mix on low until the flour is moistened and a dough forms, then increase speed to medium, and continue kneading until smooth and elastic, 4 to 5 minutes.
2. Place dough into a greased bowl, cover, and allow to rise in a warm place until doubled in bulk, about 1 1/2 hours.
3. Punch down dough, turn out onto a floured work surface, and divide into 2 equal pieces. Roll each piece into a 1/3 inch thick rectangle. Brush each square with melted butter. Mix together cinnamon and brown sugar in a small bowl, then sprinkle evenly over the two rectangles.
4. Roll each firmly into a log, pinch the ends closed, and tuck them underneath. Place each into a greased, glass loaf pan. Cover, and allow to rise in a warm place until doubled in bulk, about 45 minutes.
5. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).
6. Brush the tops of the loaves with melted butter, then bake in preheated oven until loaves are golden brown, and sound hollow when tapped, about 30 minutes.

Advent Service Project 2022

The season of Advent begins on November 27th this year. In the Catholic Church, Advent is a period of preparation over the four Sundays before Christmas. The word Advent comes from the Latin word “advenio” and means, “to come to”, and refers to the coming of Christ. Each year our school chooses a service project that will benefit an agency or families in our community.

This year we will be assisting Lighthouse Behavioral Health and Bright View. These agencies support individuals who struggle with addiction and who are seeking help with recovery. We will be collecting items such as mittens, gloves, and personal hygiene items. This will be another House competition so please watch Class Dojo and Thursday Thoughts to see what items each house will be collecting. This year’s service project will take place November 28-December 7th.
